With several hundred Marine Corps veterans from around the country, the 98th annual Marine Corps League National Convention began Monday at the WYNDHAM Springfield City Centre and continued through Saturday.

Raising of the Colors Ceremony opened the convention on Monday. Four days of business meetings followed with guest speakers, bylaws amendments introduced, debates, elections and presentations of awards.

Later on Monday the service of the Chapel of the Four Chaplains was offered. Dept. Of Maryland Chaplain Leonard Stielper was the recipient of the Legion of Honor.

Wednesday the MODD Supreme Growl was held with the announcement of the presentation of a check for \$70,000 presented to a Springfield, Illinois children's hospital from funds donated by Devil Dogs across the country. Also representing the Maryland Pack was Pack Leader PDD Craig Reeling with Craig and Evie Remines recipient of a DD Special Award.

The convention attendees were treated to various activities. which included a variety of area restaurants.

On Friday, MCL national officers were elected with Johnny Baker as our National Commandant. The week's high point was Friday night's banquet.

On Tuesday 20 July the Maryland Veterans Commission held their quarterly meeting at 100 Community Place, Crownsville, MD 22 Commissioners representing veteran organizations of Maryland were in attendance. Representing the Marine Corps League was Commissioner Stuart Blair, PDC and Bernadine Blair, MCLA DM PP.

MDVA Secretary George Owings III Report:

Maryland Veterans Trust Fund

- *For the 2021 FY the Trust awarded over \$232,000 to Maryland Veterans, averaging almost \$20,000 per month*

Charlotte Hall Veterans Home

- *As I reported at the previous meeting in April, applications and new admissions have resumed at Charlotte Hall, The census is increasing and we had 310 residents last week but we are not back to pre-pandemic numbers yet, so please help spread the work that Charlotte Hall is open and accepting new residents*

Second Veterans Home

- *Sharon Murphy, Charlotte Hall Director is preparing the application for the federal VA and discussions are taking place for site design and layout of the facility*
 1. *The Deputy Secretary and I recently visited a new Virginia Veterans Home to see the latest in design and innovation*
- *The Board of Public works recently voted to approve a vendor to prepare Part I & II documentation for 2nd home in Sykesville*
- *We are planning on a 128-bed small home concept implementing the latest technology and best practices learned from the COVID 19 outbreak*
- *Secretary Owings called on Deputy Secretary Finn to say more about the second Veterans Home*
 - *The trip to Virginia was helpful to see best practices and new plans for Veterans Homes*
 - *The plan for Maryland is a two story facility, smaller footprint, 128 beds*
 - *Initial plan had to be redesigned to allow for wheelchair turning radius*

Service and Benefits Program

- *All but one Service office is open to the public now*
- *All other Service offices are open for in-person appointments*

Cemetery and Memorials Program

- *Burials are continuing as usual, and never slowed even during the worst of the pandemic*

National POW/MIA Recognition Day

Friday, September 17, 2021
Display your flags



In the United States, **National POW/MIA Recognition Day** is observed on the third Friday in September. It honors those who were prisoners of war (POWs) and those who are still missing in action (MIA). It is most associated with those who were POWs during the Vietnam War. National Vietnam War Veterans Day is March 29, the date in 1973 when the last US combat troops departed the Republic of Vietnam.

This day was established by an Act of Congress, by the passage of Section 1082 of the 1998 Defense Authorization Act. It is one of six days that the POW/MIA Flag can be flown. The POW/MIA flag was first recognized by Pub.L. 101-355 and made into 36 U.S.C. § 189 in 1990.

The POW/MIA Flag should fly below, and not be larger than, the United States flag. It is generally flown immediately below or adjacent to the United States flag as second in order of precedence.
